The Grandest of Settings

Regent Street, designed by John Nash and completed in 1825, was commissioned by the Prince Regent (later George IV) as a grand thoroughfare linking Marylebone with Carlton House. Its neoclassical design and Portland stone façades still embody Regency elegance today.

Café Royal opened in 1865 and swiftly became a gathering place for London's artists, aristocrats and intellectuals. Its Grade II-listed rooms from the 19th and early 20th centuries have since been meticulously restored, blending period grandeur with modern sophistication.

The Pompadour Suite, one of London's most exquisite banqueting halls, hosts up to 250 guests beneath glittering chandeliers. The historic Café Royal Grill, adorned with rococo ceilings and mirrored walls, offers a striking setting for afternoon tea or private celebrations. Guests may also choose to elevate their occasion with bespoke menus from two-Michelinstarred chef Alex Dilling, creating a truly unforgettable dining experience.

Reborn in 2012 as Hotel Café Royal, the property continues to honour its storied legacy while redefining the art of modern luxury.











Moments in history have been made at Hotel Café Royal, establishing it as an enduring landmark of London's cultural, social and culinary life.

From Virginia Woolf and HG Wells to Aubrey Beardsley and Jacob Epstein, generations of writers and artists found sanctuary here. Oscar Wilde was a regular patron in the 19th century - it was at Café Royal that he courted Lord Alfred Douglas, and where he was counselled to abandon his fateful libel case against the Marguess of Queensberry.

In 1973, David Bowie chose the venue for the legendary farewell of Ziggy Stardust. Crowds gathered outside such as Lou Reed, Mick Jagger and Lulu joined him inside for what became known as "The Last Supper."

Winston Churchill is said to have awaited confirmation of his first role as prime minister in the Grill Room. King George VI and Diana, Princess of Wales lunched here often. Hollywood stars from Barbra Streisand to Elizabeth Taylor and Brigitte Bardot were drawn to its golden age glamour. And sport, too, left its mark: the Queensberry Rules for Boxing were devised here in 1867, and in later years Muhammad Ali was among the champions who attended its black-tie dinners.

Intellectuals, artists, writers, rockstars and royalty - all have passed through our doors. Today, Hotel Café Royal continues to welcome the great minds and creative spirits of our age.







Unwind in Perfect Luxury

Conceived by Sir David Chipperfield, Hotel Café Royal is home to 159 rooms and suites where heritage meets contemporary elegance. Interiors are finished in rusticated Portland stone or rich English fumed oak, creating a calm, understated luxury that reflects the building's historic character.

Each bathroom, clad in floor-to-ceiling Carrara marble, is designed as a private sanctuary - complete with rainfall showers, discreet mirror televisions, and, in many rooms, indulgent marble soaking tubs.

Alex Dilling at Hotel Café Royal


